Proposal to create more teaching space at Blacon High School

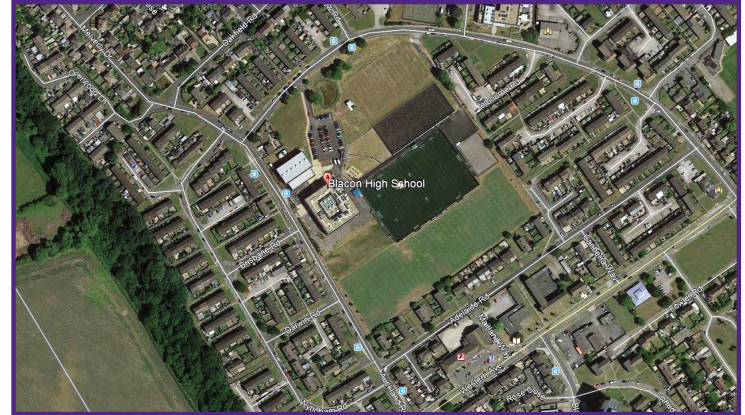
Proposals to create more teaching space at Blacon High School will go on display on 29 August, and we want to hear your views.

Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council held a public consultation in April, discussing proposals to increase the capacity of the current school from 600 pupils to 750 pupils. This enables the intake of pupils across all year groups to be increased from 120 to 150. The proposed new two-storey building would provide a range of spaces needed to respond to the increasing demand for pupil places, and will give local children a greater opportunity to access secondary education within the locality instead of being displaced elsewhere.

Next week's event will allow the council, the school and the design team to demonstrate how comments made earlier this year have shaped the proposals, and to hear your views.

The proposals will be available to view during a drop-in consultation in the School Hall at Blacon High School, Melbourne Road, Blacon, Chester CH1 5JH from noon until 7pm on Thursday 29 August 2019.
